The University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria (FH Upper Austria)

The University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria is the largest university of applied sciences in Austria and is an integral part of the tertiary education system. The organisation is defined by the requirements of regional employment and research needs. Four locations in Upper Austria's central area offer innovative and interdisciplinary academic degrees, each with a different focus.

- School of Informatics, Communications and Media – Hagenberg Campus
- School of Medical Engineering and Applied Social Sciences – Linz Campus
- School of Business and Management Steyr Campus
- → School of Engineering Wels Campus

Universities of Applied Sciences – in German 'Fachhochschulen' (FH) – are practically-orientated university-level institutions preparing students optimally for their careers. The aim of Austria's Universities of Applied Sciences is to provide a more practice-oriented education to complement the range of course offered by traditional universities. Keeping in line with the Bologna Declaration, the University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria has a system of purely Bachelor's and Master's degrees. Graduates of most of our programs are awarded the academic degree 'Bachelor' before embarking on further study for the degree of 'Master'. Keeping in line with the Bologna Declaration, the transition to the Bachelor/Master system at the University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria has already been completed in all degree programs. The transition does not only serve to improve international comparability and recognition, but also leads to a greater degree of flexibility for the students.

Austria

Austria is a beautiful country with a great cultural heritage, located in the heart of Europe. It is the home of Mozart, Klimt, Freud, and 'The Sound of Music'. Austria's snowcapped mountains, crystal clear lakes and rivers and historic cities like Vienna and Salzburg attract tourists from all over the world. The economy is very much export-orientated and the standard of living is high. The national language is German, but most people speak some English.

Upper Austria

The state of Upper Austria is located in the northern part of Austria and combines natural beauty with a thriving economy. Upper Austria is one of Europe's leading regions in education, technology and employment; in fact, about 25% of Austria's total exports originate here.

Life as an International Student in Austria

Congratulations on your decision to embark on one of life's great adventures: a period of residence and study abroad. We hope that your stay here will be a wonderful, unforgettable experience for you.

International exchange students all over the world usually experience different phases of adjustment during their stay abroad. At first you will probably see everything through the eyes of a tourist. Everything is new and exotic. After this stage you get down to the business of living your everyday life, which for some people is accompanied by a sense of disorientation or culture shock. This is a quite natural phenomenon when someone is in completely unfamiliar surroundings where everything is new.

If this affects you, please do not hesitate to speak to one of the staff involved in internationalisation. We have been through this ourselves and will be more than willing to listen and talk with you about it. You may also find it helpful to bear in mind that this is a phase that will pass and in the meantime try to keep an open mind and seek contact with other people.

General information about Steyr

Few Austrian cities are as delightful as the historic city of Steyr, which still boasts an almost completely intact medieval centre. Nearly all of the old town has been preserved in its original glory; indeed, Steyr's main square is one of the most beautiful in Europe. Most of these buildings werebuilt during the Gothic period and 'modernised' in the Renaissance, Baroque and Rococo periods.

The local economy has always been based on trade and the processing of iron and steel, which may explain why BMW, Steyr Automotive and SKF Bearings chose to locate in Steyr. Steyr Campus, which was founded in 1995, works together closely with these and other companies in the area, indeed a significant number of courses are taught by managers from such international companies. Naturally, it was in close co-operation with these and other international enterprises located in Upper Austria that our degree programs were developed.

In keeping with Steyr's industrial history, our main building is a converted former cutlery factory, which has been fully equipped with state-of-theart technology. A brand new building has been constructed right next door, comprising seminar rooms, lecture halls and computer labs.

We are located in the very centre of Steyr where the River Steyr flows into the Enns. Its many waterways and bridges symbolise the need to reach out to other parts of the world and we are continually meeting this challenge in our international activities here, to which our hundred-plus partner institutions bear witness.

Industry and research

Several important international companies have plants in and around Steyr, BMW Motors being the most famous one. It is a little known fact beyond Austria's borders that the engines for BMW's diesel cars are primarily manufactured in Steyr. Another important company in Steyr is the Swedish bearing manufacturer SKF, which is, like BMW, one of the most important industrial partners of the University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria, Steyr Campus. A third partner of Steyr Campus is the machinery construction company GFM. Other major companies in Steyr are Eckelt (glass technology), The Upper Austrian company Steyr Automotive, Engel (injection moulding technology) and Profactor (research and development).



Steyr Campus

Steyr Campus, situated in the historic part of the city known as the Wehrgraben, is an innovative, young University of Applied Sciences with about 1,300 students, 320 lecturers, 6 bachelor and 8 master programs. 6,800 graduates. The Steyr Management Campus is one of four campuses that comprise the University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria.

Management

Steyr Campus offers students modern education with a practical focus to prepare them to take leading management positions in industry. Through their studies students acquire the ability to operate successfully in a continuously changing global economy.

The professors and lecturers at Steyr Campus are highly qualified and also have a wealth of valuable practical experience; indeed, many of them work in the very fields our students will enter after graduation.

> Competence in the Practical Application of Skills

Steyr Campus also offers students the unique opportunity to study and work in close cooperation with renowned companies such as BMW, Magna, Sony, Fischer Ski, VA Steel etc. in the form of enterprise projects, semester-long industrial internships and thesis work.

Social Skills

In language training, presentations, moderation training and leadership training the students become acquainted with their individual strengths and abilities to facilitate their personal growth and development as effective team leaders.

Structure of our degree programs

All Bachelor's degree programs at Steyr Campus are designed to be completed in six semesters; the first three semesters of which constitute a foundation course, preparing students for the refinement, practice and practical application of skills in later semesters. In particular the successful execution of project seminars in local companies and service providers enables students to develop and enhance their analytical and problem solving skills and more importantly to develop strong team skills. All students complete a compulsory full-time professional internship in which they undertake practical work in an enterprise either in Austria or abroad. At the end of this semester students compare experiences and a formal presentation of the practical work is given. The students complete their Bachelor's thesis in the sixth semester.





Internationalization

The International Office is responsible for international relations within our Steyr Campus. University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria, Steyr Campus, maintains contacts to partner universities on almost all continents and realises exchanges between students and staff.

Moreover the International Office team provides services and information concerning

- opportunities for personal and professional development through overseas academic exchanges
- Assistance for international students and scholars during their stay in Steyr

Internationalisation is changing the face of business today and must therefore play an integral role in the education of future business people. Steyr Campus therefore has a firm commitment to providing its students with opportunities to broaden their horizons on an international level, not least by encouraging them to complete part of their studies abroad, either at a partner institution or by doing their internships abroad.

In addition to this, courses in various foreign languages and cultural awareness training taught almost exclusively by native speakers, frequent international faculty exchanges and the increasing number of courses in other subjects held in English encourage students to accept English as a language of everyday communication while gaining insight into different cultures.

The presence of foreign students also makes an important contribution to the internationalisation of the campus environment and students are encouraged to benefit from this fully by taking part in the Tutor System and generally seeking contact with students from other cultures.

Orientation Programme

International students are invited to arrive in Steyr on prearranged arrival days approximately two weeks before the semester begins (mid-February for the summer semester or mid-September for the winter semester) to give them time to get to know their peers and learn about their new surroundings before instruction starts.

The first orientation day offered at the beginning of Welcome week includes login instructions for university services, general information about the faculty/campus rules/ regulations and facilities provided, campus tour, introduction to life in Steyr etc.

Another important content during those days are social events organized by International office and Student Union (ÖH FH) such as excursions to Upper Austria and get together party.

International Fair

Every semester an International Fair is organised to which all international students are invited to provide information on their home countries and universities and cook traditional dishes from their home countries.

International Week

Once during the academic year, University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria invites professors from our partner and other universities to come to Steyr. During the week the professors teach our students in different management topics such as Marketing, Sales, Intercultural Management, Intercultural Business Relations and Logistics Management. The International Fair takes place during this week as well.

Arrival Dates

The Welcome Week usually starts mid-February and mid-September. Exact arrival dates for specific semesters are provided in the acceptance letter and welcome email that we send to students whose applications have been accepted.

ECTS

ECTS ('European Credit Transfer System') credits are a numerical value (between 1 and 60) allocated to course units to denote the student workload required to complete them. They reflect a quantity of work required by each course unit in relation to the total quantity of work necessary to complete a full year of academic study at the institution, which includes lectures, practical work, seminars, tutorials, fieldwork and private study as well as assessment activities. Thus, the ECTS system is based on a full student workload and not limited to contact hours only.

The basic allocation of academic credits in ECTS is 60 credits for a full year of study or 30 credits for a semester. Exchange students require to attend courses for the equivalent of at least 25 ECTS per semester.

Credits are awarded only when the course has been completed and all required examinations have been passed. In other words, students do not get ECTS credits simply for attending classes or spending time abroad, but must fulfil the assessment requirements of the host institution to demonstrate that they satisfy the specified learning objectives for the course unit.



Grading system

The Austrian education system works with 5 grades:

80% of attendance should be maintained in order to write an exam and pass the course.

Academic information

Although the primary language of instruction at Steyr Campus is German, as part of our commitment to internationalisation an increasing number of courses are offered in English. To attend German courses, incoming student should provide German language certificate confirming B2 level or higher. Types of classes

Integrated Course

An integrated course combines various subjects or topics into a single curriculum. It often provides a holistic understanding of a specific field by blending different disciplines, concepts, or skills into one cohesive program of study.

Seminar

A seminar is a small group discussion or interactive class focused on a specific topic or area of study. It encourages active participation and in-depth exploration of ideas through discussions, presentations, and collaborative learning.

→ Lecture

A lecture is a teaching method where an instructor imparts knowledge or information to a larger group of students. It typically involves a one-way communication, with the lecturer delivering information through spoken discourse, visual aids, or multimedia presentations.

Practice-Oriented Session

A practice-oriented session is designed to provide handson experience or practical training in a particular field or skill. It allows students to apply theoretical knowledge in real-world situations, often through exercises, simulations, or practical tasks.

Project

A project-based class involves students working on a specific project or task, often in groups. These projects can vary widely in scope and objectives and aim to develop problem-solving skills, teamwork, and the application of knowledge to real-world challenges.

Course Registration

Incoming students can choose courses they would like to attend starting from application process and add selected courses to learning agreement. However the final decision and course registration is made during the orientation week. Students enter university portal for course booking where they are provided with timetable of each course, complete list of available courses and places. After all courses are booked, international office enroll students to courses according to their chose. Every student has one week time to change the decision, cancel or add courses.



Attendance Policy

Students are expected to attend and participate fully in all lectures, seminars and projects in which they have elected to take part. Attendance lists may be kept at the discretion of the individual faculty members.

To be allowed for exam and pass the course, attendance of each student should be 80% or higher. This means that systematical or unjustified missing of classes may lead to reexamination or fail of the course. Lecturer should be notified individually in case of skipping the course and additional task or assignment may be offered.

The examination period is from 1 October to 14 February in the winter semester and from 1 March to 14 July in the summer semester. Students will be informed of the date, place and time of examinations, and given details of the examination procedure by the course.

The lectures are assessed by final course examination. Active participation, group work, performance during the course amounts to 20-30% of the mark for the course. Biggest part of the mark (70-80%) consists from final examination results.

Examinations

In general, registration for a course at the beginning of the term counts as registration for the examination. The only exceptions are changes made to the Learning Agreement within the prescribed period. To complete a term successfully, students must be examined on every course they have attended. Examinations may take various forms: formal written or oral examinations, assessment of course work, a combination of the two or other means such as presentations during seminars, etc. Students are expected to be present to sit exams here in Steyr.

Cultural shocks in Austria



Language barrier

Austria's official language is German, and while many Austrians speak English, international students may still face communication challenges, especially in rural areas. In tourist areas many people do in fact speak English but elsewhere most shop assistants and waiters speak very little English if any. Especially the older generation may consider it arrogant to expect everyone to speak English. Showing respect for Austrian culture by learning a few key words of German can help make everyday communication run more smoothly.

Punctuality

Austrians are known for their punctuality, and being even a few minutes late to appointments or classes may be considered rude.

Politeness and formality

Austrian culture places a high value on politeness and formality, with titles like "Herr" (Mr.) and "Frau" (Mrs.) being commonly used.

When entering shops, especially smaller ones, but also legal entities, university buildings, coffee shops, banks, greet the person at the counter. A 'Guten Tag' or 'Grüß Gott' is simply expected of well-mannered people. This even applies to outdoor markets.

Cash-Centric society

Austria is known for its cash-based transactions, and credit cards are not as widely accepted as in some other countries. Despite credit cards and cashless payments become much more popular in recent years, but still you should always have some cash and be ready that the place you just made purchases at doesn't accept cards at all or below certain sum.

Store hours

Many shops and businesses close early around 7pm (6pm on Saturdays), and Sundays are typically reserved for family time, with most stores closed. Some businesses and shops, especially in smaller towns and rural areas, may close for a few hours during the afternoon (usually between 12:00 PM and 3:00 PM) for a traditional lunch break. This is known as the "Mittagspause."

In larger cities like Vienna and Salzburg, certain supermarkets and convenience stores may stay open later, often until 9:00 PM or 10:00 PM

Recycling and environmental practices

Austria has strict recycling and environmental regulations, and students may need to learn and follow these practices diligently.

Under Austrian law it is compulsory toseparate your rubbish for recycling. Special binsare provided for glass, metal, plastic packaging, organic waste, recyclable paper and remaining non-recyclable waste. Additionally, all packaging materials have to be cleaned before being thrown away. In order to maintain a harmonious relationship with your neighbours, landlord and even to avoid problems with the authorities, it is important that you comply with this law.

Essential information

Formalities in Austria

For students from EU countries and Switzerland a valid passport is sufficient. Non-EU citizens please contact your local Austrian Consulate for details of current visa regulations for Austria.

Registration with the local authorities

Under Austrian law all changes of address have to be registered with the local authority within three working days. Of course this also applies to foreign students. In order to register you will need to take your passport (with a valid visa if applicable) and a Residence Registration, 'Meldezettel', to the local registration office, 'Meldeamt'.

Meldezettel can be uploaded from the official website, be provided by the landlord or be taken directly from Rathaus. After registering you will be given an official printout of your registration details which should be kept safe and will be needed along with a second 'Meldezettel' when registering your departure.

The registration offices, 'Meldeamt' for the City of Steyr can be found in the City Hall, 'Rathaus' on the Stadtplatz and opening hours are:

→ from 08:00 to 12:00 from Monday to Friday

→ and from 13:30 to 16:00 on Mondays and Tuesdays

Climate and clothing

Austria gets very cold in the winter with temperatures sometimes dropping below -10°C, so we recommend that you bring warm clothes and shoes with good sturdy soles for the winter semester, however, although you may associate Austria with winter sports, we often enjoy warm summers with temperatures sometimes up to and even above 30°C.

Currency

Since the beginning of 2002, Austria's currency has been the euro (€). 1 euro = 100 cents



'Anmeldebescheinigung' – Confirmation of registration

(For Nationals of EU/EEA countries only!)

If you are staying in Austria for longer than 3 months you have to apply for a confirmation of registration (Anmeldebescheinigung) at the relevant municipal authority (Magistrat). You have to apply for this confirmation within the first four months of your stay in Austria. This registration is obligatory in addition to the registration according to the Residence Registration (Meldezettel). In case of non-compliance with this regulation a fine may be imposed.

Banking hours

Banking hours in Austria vary, but as a general rule banks open between 8:00 and 16:30 Monday to Friday and often close for one or two hours at lunchtime. Many banks also close on Friday afternoons. You will need to check the exact opening hours of the bank of your choice, as the above is just a general guideline.

Credit cards

An increasing number of businesses in Austria accept major international credit cards such as Visa and Mastercard, although many companies only accept these for purchases above a certain price.

Medical services and pharmacies

Austria boasts an excellent network of pharmacies and medical practitioners. Pharmacies operate a rota system for night and Sunday duty. When a pharmacy is closed a notice is displayed giving details of the nearest open pharmacy.

Health insurance coverage

Austria has an excellent public health care system. If you are staying in Austria for less than one year, you should find out if there is an agreement between your home country and Austria regarding health insurance. Between EU countries there is reciprocal health insurance system. You need to bring your health card ('e-card') before coming to Steyr to ensure that you can be treated in Austria in the event of any illness without having to pay anything yourself. International students who are non-EU citizens have the possibility to apply for full health insurance coverage in Austria from the Upper Austria Health Insurance Company (OÖGKK) for a monthly fee. Students can insure themselves for as long as necessary.

To register for insurance with OÖGKK you need the following:

- Confirmation of enrolement at Steyr Campus and Studienbuchblatt
- → Your Residence Registration (Meldezettel)
- → Proof of health insurance coverage in your home country during the last 12 months

The Upper Austria Health Insurance Company will then issue you an insurance card which covers hospital stays, medical treatment and services, and reduced prescription charges.

Non-Emergency medical treatment

You just take your European Health insurance card ('e-card') and visit the doctor/dentist. You will find a list of English speaking doctors in your apartment, or you can always ask in the International Office for help. If you are from a country that does not have such a reciprocal health care agreement with Austria, you should follow the instructions of your insurance company concerning cost coverage for medical treatment.

Discount Rail Travel

'ÖBB-Vorteilscard<26' – It is recommended that students intending to travel extensively within Austria purchase an ÖBB-Vorteilscard<26. The Vorteilscard<26 entitles holders to a 50% discount on all tickets for travel on the Austrian Federal Railway Network and is available to anyone under the age of 26 at the reduced price of € 19.90 and is valid for one year. For students over the age of 26 the Vorteilscard costs € 99.90.

Internet and intranet

Double degree students don't need to work on their individual learning agreement as the double degree agreement between the University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria and the partner university specifies the exact classes incoming student have to take in Steyr in order to fulfil the requirements for a double degree. Double degree students participate also in the Welcome Week, two weeks before the start of the semester, just like regular incoming students. After completing the courses in Steyr, double degree students International Degree Seeking Students return to their home countries and continue their studies. After graduation, double degree students will receive certificates of completed studies and transcript of records from Steyr. They are also invited to the graduation ceremony in Linz in July.



Degree programs

Bachelor Students

Besides the Global Sales and Marketing Program, which is taught in English, all other Bachelor programs are taught in German. If you are interested in applying for a Bachelor program, you need to contact the assistant of the appropriate Bachelor's degree program. After sending your application you will be invited for a written test and interview in Steyr.

Master Students

Whereas the Global Sales and Marketing program is taught entirely in English, 'Accounting, Controlling and Financial Management', 'Operations Management', 'Supply Chain Management' and 'Digital Business Management' can only be chosen if students speak fluent German. If you are interested in applying for a Master's degree, please contact the appropriate assistant of the Master program and check the prerequisites for Master studies described on our web page. Please be advised to apply early enough – at least six months in advance – as the Austrian authorities may take a very long time to issue a visa. After sending your application you will be invited for an interview covering a case study, which you will be given time to prepare.

When you arrive in Steyr, you will also be in touch with the assistant of your degree program and the International Office. The International Office invites you to the Welcome Week, which takes place in mid-September, just two weeks prior to the start of the academic year.

Our degree programs

Steyr Campus offers six different highly professionally oriented degree programs in the new Bachelor system and five Master's degree programs in which students acquire specialist expertise, social skills and competence in the practical application of skills.



Bachelor's Degree Programs

Accounting, Controlling and Financial Management (F | P)

Global Sales and Marketing (F)

This interdisciplinary program imparts specialist competence in the fields of sales management, b2b-marketing, mechatronics and negotiation skills, even in a foreign language. A second foreign language besides English (which is also the language of tuition) and a semester in a non-German speaking country are obligatory. Current double degree agreements with partner institutions in Denmark, Finland, the Netherlands, Poland, and Russia enable 30% of students to acquire a second degree and further double degree agreements are planned.
